Program

Start village (Dennis Minson Drive, Gatton)

7:45am - Registration opens (keep social distancing requirements in mind).

8:50am – All spectator vehicles must depart from Gatton and move to the KoM/QoM line, the drinks station at Pilton Soldiers Memorial Hall, or the finish village in Warwick.

Rider support vehicles are not permitted to follow the race

Unfortunately, the hall itself will not be open to race followers again this year, but you will still be able to set up and provide nutrition to your rider(s) in this area.

Finish Village - Victoria Street, Warwick

Vehicles are <u>not</u> permitted to park on the finish straight, in either direction.

11:00am - Finish Village opens

A BBQ lunch, refreshments and toilets will be available at the finish village.

Hand sanitiser will be available at various locations. Please ensure social distancing is practiced at all times.

11:15am - First racers scheduled to finish

2:30pm - All riders expected to have finished. Finish village to close

Presentations (Finish Village - Victoria Street, Warwick)

In compliance with COVID safe principles, presentations will be held for each grade at the alongside the finish straight, as soon as results are for each race.

COVID safe requirements

All persons attending the race and any associated locations, must familiarise themselves with, and abide by the latest Public Health Rules and accompanying COVID requirements at all times.

Race numbers

Each rider will receive two race numbers. One is to be pinned on the jersey pockets in the centre lower back, and the other to the left side at the lower rib cage. Pins will be provided to attach numbers.

Riders are welcome to keep their race numbers as a souvenir of the upperlimb.com Cunningham Classic for 2021.

Electronic timing

Each rider will be issued with an electronic timing chip at registration used to determine your time in the race. A full list of times will be posted on the race website as soon as possible, following the completion of the race.

Riders are required to <u>return the electronic chip</u> at the finish village immediately following their grade's completion. <u>A \$95 fee</u> will be charged to riders who do not return their timing chip on race day. Please bring your own zip tie remover.

Please note race results are determined by the race Commissaires, and not from the electronic timing system.

Classifications

upperlimb.com winner's jersey is awarded to the overall race winner, the first to cross the line in their grade in Warwick.

The King/Queen of the Mountain jersey is awarded to the first rider in their grade to cross the top of the KoM/QoM point (around 40.5km from the start).

The Most Impressive Rider award is given to the rider who lights up the road with the most exciting performance in their grade (or division for Women's racing).

Prize money will be awarded to the winners as stated above, well as the minor placings in each race. Prize money will be paid to your nominated bank account.













Women's racing

All women will race in either Division 1 or Division 2 but will compete in separate grades (Women's A & B or Women's C & D) and will be awarded placings for upperlimb.com winner, 2nd-5th place and Queen of the Mountain prizes. There will only be one Most Impressive Rider prize awarded for each overall Division. All women's grade compete for equal prizes to the men's grades.

Under 19 racing

Under 19 riders have been allocated to their respective Elite Men/Women's grades and will compete within that grade. There are no separate results or prizes for U19 riders.

Spare wheels and warmup clothing

Riders are permitted to have their spare wheels carried by the official spares vehicles. Riders wheels must be clearly labelled with their name and race division. Spare wheels are to be left at the signed areas near the spares vehicles along Dennis Minson Drive at the start village.

No spares in, no spares out. There will be no neutral wheels.

As all rider support vehicles must depart Gatton by 8:50am, riders are encouraged to wear suitable warmup clothing, and leave it (and any other belongings) with their race divisions spares vehicle for transportation to Warwick. Plastic bags available for personal belongings.

Spare wheels and warm- up clothing (and any other belongings from the spares vehicle) will be available for collection at the finish village in Warwick. Please collect your items as soon as possible after the race to allow volunteers to move to other duties.

Electronic communications

No electronic communication devices (i.e. Race radio or mobile phones) are allowed in individual events in Queensland, including this race. THIS IS NOT A TEAM EVENT.

Drinks station and litter zone - Pilton Hall

Competitors in all race divisions can take on drinks at the designated drinks station at Pilton Soldiers Memorial Hall, approximately 48.5km from the start and 7.5km after the KoM/QoM point.

There will be a Litter Zone 200m before the Drinks Zone and 200m immediately after the Drinks Zone.

Feeders are permitted to collect discarded water bottles. Any water bottles left at the end of the race will be disposed of.

Unfortunately, due to Covid concerns the hall itself will not be open to race followers again this year, but you will still be able to set up and provide nutrition to your rider(s) in this area.

Please maintain social distancing at this location.













Live race results and claiming places

Riders are requested to claim their places at the finish line following each race. Race places may include upperlimb.com 1st to 5th place overall and King or Queen of the Mountain. You do not need to claim the Most Impressive Rider prize (although we enjoy a good story).

Race results and times will be posted to the Cycling Queensland's Live Results webpage as soon as they become available, including the KoM/QoM and Most Impressive Rider classifications.

Presentations

As racing is conducted under the current Covid safe principals, presentations will be held for each grade at the finish village alongside the finish straight, as soon as results are available for that race.

Presentations will be held on a socially distanced podium.

Hand sanitiser will be available at the presentation area for use by riders and volunteers prior to presentation.

Podium place getters and competition winners to provide bank details for EFT payment of prize monies.

Safety

Please familiarise yourself with and abide by the latest Public Health Rules and accompanying COVIO requirements at all times.

Riders must follow all Queensland road rules during the race

This includes no crossing of the centre line of the road at any time. Any riders who fall behind the lead group are to travel as a "road user" and must obey all road rules. Failure to follow Queensland Road Rules will result in a fine from race officials and/or the police. Riders may also be disqualified and/or face additional AusCycling Queensland sanctions.

In the interests of safety for both riders and motorists, and to comply with the Department of Transport and Main Roads and Police Permits:

All vehicles must leave the start village before 8:50am

This is to allow you time to move along the course and park to watch the riders pass either at the KoM/QoM point, the drinks station at Pilton Hall or in the finish village at Warwick.

Competitors are encouraged to leave warm- up clothing etc. With their race groups' official spares vehicle in the plastic bags provided, and collect them at the finish village.













Rider support vehicles are not permitted to follow the race

In previous years, the Police have stopped race divisions to allow numerous vehicles following the race to pass. Most of these were rider's support vehicles. Riders, please instruct the drivers of your support vehicles that they MUST leave Gatton by 8:50 and proceed either to the KoM/QoM point, the drinks station at Pilton Hall or to the finish village at Victoria Street, Warwick.

Points 22 & 23 below are taken straight from the Police permit.

- 22. Should more than four (4) vehicles be adversely delayed behind the event, participants and event support vehicle/s are to move to the left of the roadway, pausing if necessary, until the traffic has cleared.
- 23. The event is to be temporarily suspended by the applicant, participant/s or police if undue traffic delays are experienced along the route. The suspension is to be for as long as it takes to clear the traffic buildup

Drivers of vehicles following the race may be fined by the police and their rider will be disqualified

The conditions allowing the necessary permits for this event require that non-race traffic is able to approach and pass the convoys safely, which is made difficult if rider support vehicles are caught queuing behind the race.

No vehicles are permitted to park on the Victoria Street finish straight in either direction

Victoria Street will be intermittently closed to traffic as each group finishes. This area will be controlled by police, traffic control and race officials whose directions must be followed.

Thank you in advance for your co-operation in assisting with the duty of care to maintain the safety of yourselves, as well as other riders and road users to ensure the future viability of this historic race.














Finish line

In the heat of the race, riders are often confused as to the actual position of the finish line. They see the orange traffic cones lining the road starting at the finish village and start sprinting for this point.

For safety reasons, the finish line in Warwick is not in-line with the finish village but is placed 130m further along. The road is too narrow leading up to the finish village but widens out after this point allowing for a safer sprint.

Riders should also note that there is an intersection 100m beyond the finish line. All riders must stop before the roundabout and check for traffic before riding back on the opposite side of the road (not on the footpath).








Course Map
